Beverly introduced me to competitive ice skating a few years ago and while I dislike sitting on my bum so much, I find the music and dance form quite entertaining.

I've been to three World Competitions: Boston, Helsinki and Milan and was ready for Tokyo but the tickets were slow to get priced and I decided on a river cruise from Prague to Berlin with Tom instead.

Competition with internationals has become much more enjoyable as the Americans simply don't have it except in a few minor cases. The beautiful skaters like Jason Brown and Ashley Wagner didn't have a change against the little Asians when all the jumping/quads got into the program. This was Skate America, the first in the Grand Prix Series, with international skaters like the Russians, Italians, Canadians, and even a new Malaysian skater.

### To Everett for Skate America competition.

To the airport on my way to Seattle and then drive about an hour and a half north to Everett where my sister Beverly and I will be watching skate America competition.

I have given up on national skating events because the Americans haven't been very competitive. We are skipping both Detroit Nationals and Anaheim Four Continents. Beverly follows the junior competition and says we may have some talent coming up and the couple videos she sent were very hopeful.

I like the world's competition and in December will go to Vancouver for the Grand Prix finals. All because we have Russians, Canadians, Italians, etc. there.

This is not to say the Americans are not capable but my personal believe is it has to do with other countries supporting their artists whereas Americans don't get sponsors until they are already winners. In addition, in my, to my view, the heavy emphasis on quads and the athletics has damaged our larger framed Americans.
