How do you pronounce Munch? It is not like munching on food. It sounds more like Monk.


<u>Is it the flu season</u> or the lazy season? About 1/3 of the bus was a no-show despite us waiting a little later for them to show up. They did not.

The Experimental Self: Edvard Munch's Photography At The Scandinavia House: Lunch At Smorgas Chef

The iconic painting, *The Scream*, was only a small part of Norwegian artist Edvard Munch's prodigious output. Explore an impressive selection of some 45 paintings by Munch including seven works never before shown in the United States. View Sick Mood at Sunset, Despair (1892) which is being displayed outside of Europe for only the second time in its history – it is the earliest depiction and compositional genesis of The Scream. Visit the Scandinavia House: The Nordic Center of America for a guided tour of the master painter's photographic work also on view for the first time in the United States. The Experimental Self exhibition emphasizes Munch's playful techniques – resulting in



a collection of photographs that have been rendered poetic. Indulge in the Nordic cuisine of Smorgas Chef

This is the third and final stop of this traveling show from the Munch Museum in Oslo. SfMoma one of the three.
