

Vancouver Grand Prix Finals Trip Notes <u>December 4 – 12, 2018</u>

- This was the Grand Prix Finals, and we were in the USs event this October held in Everett
 Washington. Next year's Grand Prix Finals will be in Strasbourg France where Tom and I visited
 this September. Beverly and I will want to go and maybe Tom too.
- Cold and wet in Vancouver. Very cold in the stadium and even the moderators were telling of going out to coffee shops to get warm.
- Lovely and luxurious (to me) two-bedroom apartment.
- Food was better than most stadiums but still unhealthy and too much of it. You just sit and stare and eat. I added drinking. The results came home to roost when I stepped on a scale.
- Beverly is the perfect travel companion for this. She knows all the skaters, remembers them all, can pronounce the names of so many foreigners with multi syllable names, is willing to share her knowledge, and is a good roommate.

Off to Vancouver – or as Tom says: somebody has to do it; and life is good.

Tuesday, December 4 had me off to another skating event for nine days. I met up with my sister, Beverly, in the San Francisco airport where we went onto Vancouver Canada together, got a rental car, followed by settling into a lovely apartment in the old historic district of Kitsilano.

Our apartment is one of the nicest outside of my Paris rental company. We chose a two bedroom located between the skating arena on University of British Columbia campus and downtown Vancouver but in a lively historic area full of shops and restaurants. Would we have any time for shopping or restaurants? NOT! Or very little.



We had near five days like that and the other three as easy tourists. I was in Vancouver a few days maybe in 2012 pre a week long hike in the Whistler area; then more recently with Tom for about a week when I did Vancouver's marathon. Tom had then arranged a high rise apartment with a massive amount of windows and views. He found our current apartment too. Maybe he will next find us an apartment in Strasbourg.

Weather. Despite it being from 30 to 40 outside, it's felt colder indoors. I've really suffered numb hands despite many layers of clothes and doubled gloves. You don't get a cold from being cold? Maybe it's the constant shivering that has me working on a cold. Or not even being near a bed long enough let alone able to sleep. Beverly has kindly spared me the cleaning of car frost in the morning. I'm not acclimated to cold as much because my last trip was in the Caribbean with mid to high 80s.

Food. Fortunately we stocked up on groceries (and alcohol) our first day when Beverly cooked a huge pot of vegetable, chicken and veggie noodles. It's a good thing as we've mostly subsided on junk stadium food followed by midnight bowls of healthy soup. This arena does have more decent food than usual but it's a mistake to not leave for a real meal. We were afraid of missing some super skater. Smile. What we missed was civilized dining but the stadium soup and chile were good as were the peanut-butter sandwiches from the apartment (one had to sneak in food to get through security.)

<u>Still, life is good.</u> It's wonderful to be with my easy going, smart and expert-on-skating sister. We are looking for more events but are at least committed to Greensboro NC in January 2020 for nationals and Montreal in March 2020 for World's.

After a couple of days of tourist we go home on Wednesday, December 12. End

Every room had lots of lighting and its own thermostat. The bathroom tub and shower were all in one which was a neat idea, huge number of lights, eight each of towels and washcloths as well as two luxurious robes, all the usual hotel amenities, and a heated floor.
